

Public Acceptance Dog Certification Test Overview

Summary

Evaluation is required to assess if the student have obtained a defined level of knowledge and competency to be Public Acceptance Dog Certified.

In order to pass the evaluation, the dog must not fail any exercises, peeing or pooping in the examination hall will be an instant failure.

Students who have successfully passed the evaluation will received a certificate of award, PADC scarf and an ID card.

Exercise 1 | Environment Test

Dog is required to walk beside the handler according to his or her pace without leash at all time. Distractions such as food, dogs, people and moving objects will be brought into the exercise.

If the dog refuses to follow their handler or walk according to the pace, it will be an instant failure.

Exercise 2 | Stand for Examination

Handler is required to command his or her dog to a standing position and stand 5 meters away from the dog. Examiner will proceed to examine the dog and if the dog walks away from the examiner it will be an instant failure.

Exercise 3 | Recall with 3 stages of distractions

Handler is required to recall his or her dog back from 10 meters distance without leash with 3 stages of distractions that includes moving object, people, dogs and food. After recalling, the dog has to be sited in front of the handler and finish it with a turn around heel movement.

If the dog fails to come it will be an instant failure.

Exercise 4 | 2 Minutes Off Sight Sit Stay

Handler is required to command his or her dog to a sit stay position and leave the dog sight for 2 minutes.

Distraction such as toys, moving object, people and food will be brought into the exercise.

It will be an instant failure if the dog break it position during the exercise.

Exercise 5 | 5 Minutes Off Sight Down Stay

Handler is required to command his or her dog to a down stay position and leave the dog sight for 5 minutes

Distraction such as toys, moving object, people and food will be brought into the exercise.

It will be an instant failure if the dog break it position during the exercise.
